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<u>Istanbul Transit Tour</u> (3 nights/4 days) November 2023 to March 2024

<u>Day 1 - Arrival at Istanbul Airport:</u> You will be received by a friendly Mavi Tour representative to be transferred to the hotel.

Stay at Great Fortune Design Hotel, a 4-star hotel located in the old city and at walking distance for most of the historical sites. https://greatfortunehotels.com. Stay in a single, double, or triple bedroom with breakfast. Or similar hotels depending on the availability at the time of booking.

No tour will be organized this day for you to rest, relax and overcome the jet lag. You are free to explore the city or nearby places to hotel on your own.

Day 2 - Istanbul

Pick up from the hotel after breakfast at 9.00am. An English-speaking tour guide will be available to today to visit the following sites:

- **Topkapi Palace Museum:** This palace was built in 1460 by Fatih Sultan Mehmet, the conqueror of Istanbul. It is used as an official administration center and residence of the sultans with separate quarters for women called "Harem". In 1856 the sultans moved to Dolmabahce. Closed on Tuesday's alternately you will be visiting the Dolmabahce palace.
- **Hagia Sophia:** This structure was built in 537 by Byzantine Emperor Justinian as basilica which was converted to a mosque in 1453 when Sultan Mehmet captured Istanbul in 1453, Ata Turk converted this into a museum in 1935 and again in 2019 it was converted into a mosque.
- **Blue Mosque:** The Blue Mosque (Called Sultanahmet Camii in Turkish) was built during the reign of Sultan Ahmet in 1616. It is also known as Blue Mosque because of blue tiles surrounding the walls of interior design.

- **Hippodrome:** Built by Roman Emperor Severus in early 3rd Century. The Byzantine emperors loved nothing more than an afternoon at the chariot races, and this rectangular arena alongside Sultanahmet Park was their venue of choice. In its heyday, it was decorated by obelisks and statues, some of which remain in place today.
- **Cistern:** This underground water storage system was built by the Byzantine Emperor Constantine in the 4th Century to supple water to the city of Constantinople. The water was transported from the Belgrade Forest by the immense aqueducts.
- **Hodjapasha:** The SEMA ceremony is a spiritual journey of whirling dervishes for divine love. Starts at 7.00pm to last for one hour.

Lunch break: 12.00-13.00. After the show you can walk back to the hotel.

Day 3 - Istanbul

Pick up from the hotel after breakfast at 9.00am to visit the historical sites of:

- Covered Market: Covered Bazar built in 15th century, is the oldest covered market in the world covering an area of 55,000 sq. meters having around 4,000 shops. It has 21 gates, 51 streets and around 4,000 shops selling all type of items including tiles, ceramics, gold, silver, leather goods, carpets, and kilims and many more gift items. Half a day. Closed on Sundays, an alternate could be to visit the spice market.
- **Dolmabahce Palace:** Dolmabahçe Palace was built between years 1843-1856 by the Empire's 31st Sultan Abdulmecid I at cost of \$1.9 billion. The palace was home to six Sultans from 1856, when it was first inhabited, up until the abolition of the Caliphate in 1924. Atatürk spent the last days of his medical treatment in this palace, where he died on November 10, 1938. It has 285 rooms, 46 halls, 6 baths and 68 toilets. The world's largest Bohemian crystal chandelier is in the Ceremonial Hall having 750 lamps and weighs 4.5 tonnes. Dolmabahçe has the largest collection of Bohemian and Baccarat crystal chandeliers in the world. *Closed on Mondays, alternately you will be visiting the Topkapi palace*.
- Istiklal (walking) street at Taksim and Galata Tower: İstiklal Avenue, historically known as the Grand Avenue of Pera is one of the most famous avenues in Istanbul, Turkey, visited by nearly 3 million people in a single day over the course of weekends. It is a 1,5 km. long colorful pedestrian street and grand boulevard cutting through Beyoglu and full of all kinds of shops, restaurants, cafes, street shows and it is located by the Taksim Square. The nostalgic tram runs through the length of the Istiklal Street.

Drop back to the hotel by 7.00pm, if you prefer to stay longer on Istiklal street take a cab for the hotel.

Da 4 – Istanbul / Istanbul Airport

Depart for the Istanbul Airport. Time to be decided depending on the flight timings.
